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

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# **Pre- Meeting Program**: Bruce Berr's Frontier Sonatina and Eight Sound Poems

## **Presenter: Jennifer Merry**



Bruce Berr was a beloved member of NSMTA for over 30 years, and during that time he composed and published a number of delightful educational pieces at the elementary and intermediate levels. In this pre-meeting presentation, Jennifer will play and discuss his Frontier Sonatina, an intermediate level piece in three movements, published by FJH in 2015, as well as selections from Eight Sound Poems, a collection of intermediate to late-intermediate pieces published in 2013 by Opus Music. Bruce's thoughtful craftsmanship, pedagogy and personality are well represented in these pieces, which deserve to be taught and performed

more often!

#### **Program: Creating A World of Colors from Black and White: Techniques and Approaches to Voicing**

This presentation will examine pianistic techniques and approaches to thinking about voicing, with examples and solutions from a variety of repertoire.

Remote (Video Submission) Exam Details:

- Deadline to submit is by **April 21 at 11:59pm** (end of day). Please be mindful of the deadline, as no late submission will be allowed.
- It is the *student's* responsibility to ensure that access to all videos and music files is unrestricted.
- It is the *teacher's* responsibility to review these contents and sign off on them prior to the deadline.
- Video evaluation period is April 24-28

Technique Sheets will be sent out to all students (regardless of Remote or In Person) on the Friday prior to their exam date or remote submission deadline.

All Judges (remote and in person) will be able to view their judging schedule and repertoire lists prior to their judging day or evaluation period in the Member Portal.

- **Remote** *digital* student exam sheets will be returned to teachers via their Teacher Folders in the Member Portal, under resources.
- Due to delayed or lost mailings, In Person student exam sheets will be made available for pick up at designated dates and locations to ensure timely receipt of exam sheets. Information will be forthcoming by coordinators via email.

AIM Awards (medals and plaques) will be ordered after May 8. Email will be sent to teachers for designated dates and locations for pick up when all awards are available, hopefully by late May. *This year's statuette is Felix Mendelssohn.*
